

NINE SOLDIERS GIVEN PAPERS

Naturalization Hearing Is Held at Courthouse Here.

Nine soldiers—a majority of whom were from the 106th Division at Camp Atterbury—were made citizens of the United States at a naturalization hearing conducted Friday morning at the courthouse.

W. Nelson Brown of the Cincinnati immigration office was the examiner in charge, and Judge George W. Long of Bartholomew circuit court administered the oath.

Members of the group were John Huzinec, born in Czechoslovakia; Emanuel Efthiminu, born in Makri, Turkey; John Paul Hruska, born in Czechoslovakia; Jack Gordon Paterson, born in Canada; Nicholas Robert Brigadier, born in Germany; Manuel Valenzuela, born in Mexico; Ephriam Ingber, born in Russia; Florent John Charlier, born in Belgium; and Kurt Wasserman, born in Germany.

The soldiers were at the courthouse throughout the morning for final examinations before receiving the oath.
