

106TH TEAM STATE CHAMPS

Win Semi-Pro Baseball Title—To Compete At Wichita, Kansas

CAMP ATTERBURY, August 4— Indiana's No. 1 semi-professional baseball team is the 106th Division's Cubs.

The Cubs became state champions after winning the Indiana Semi-Professional Baseball tournament at Winchester, Monday, by overwhelming Richmond, 17-0. In the first playoff game Sunday afternoon, the Lionment trounced Parker, 9-0.

The Cubs will represent the Hoosier state at the National Semi-Professional Baseball Congress in Wichita. Kan., starting Aug. 12. State champions from 48 states will attend the tournament, which will last two weeks. The 106th team will leave for Wichita next Tuesday or Wednesday.

Livingston Stars.

In winning the championship, Pvt. Micky Livingston, former catcher for the Chicago Cubs and a member of Co. D. 423rd Infantry, was the star performer. In the Richmond game, Livingston hit four home runs in four times at bat, while in the tilt with Parker, the first baseman got four hits out of four appearances at the plate.

Pfc. Frank Baety, Division Hq. Co., had everything under control in the final game. He pitched a no-hit, no-run tilt against Richmend, Monday. Beaty had splendid support in the field and at bat, with the Lionmen banging the opposition for 18 hits.

T/5 Bernie Kincanon, Division Hq. Co., tamed Parker handily,too, allowing but 14 hits to the opposition's two. A large crowd jammed the Winchester park for the Sunday game and adopted the Cubs as their team,
