CAMP ATTERBURY, August 4 .-Cannon Co., of the 424th Infantry, is the scene or today's top-kick interview, and the 1st sergeant being cross-examined is a 23-year-cld West Virginian who enlisted in the Army in July, 1942, and is now 'growing old with the men."

The top-kick is 1st Sgt. James R. Wheeler, who is known as a "good egg" everywhere in the 424th area. Just tipping 5 ft. 8 inches and weighing 160 pounds, Wheeler does not resemble the magazines' versions of a 1st sergeant. As one of his men remarked, "He's just one of the boys."

Before answering Uncle Sam's call, Wheeler was a coal miner in Elkins, W. Va. He received his basic training with the 80th Division at Camp Forrest, Tenn., and before long was rated from Pfc. to staff sergeant. He then transferred as part of the original cadre for the 106th Division at Ft. Jackson, S. C.

Wheeler was assigned to a cannon company - something new in he started from scratch, but in October, 1943 knew his job well enough to rate the top-kick post of the 424th's company. His willingness "to learn with the boys" brought him closer to his men.

Maneuvers were uneventful, according to Wheeler, but a GI in the orderly room revealed the top-kick spent two weeks in the hospital because he went out to check up on his men during a blackout. He reed against a towed gun.
