

## Pvt. Engelking Listed Missing Since Dec. 21

**Young Private Was  
Member of 106th  
Division—Had Been  
Overseas Two Months**

Mr. and Mrs. Morrison Engelking, 412 East Fifth street, have received a telegram informing them that their son, Private Lowell E. Engelking is missing in action since December 21 in Germany. Pvt. Engelking was a member of the 106th Infantry Division, which suffered heavy casualties during the German counteroffensive in December.

Pvt. Engelking was nineteen years old last September 17 and attended Rockford School. He was employed at the Seymour Woolen Mills prior to his induction into the armed forces November 27, 1943.

### **Was At Fort Thomas.**

He received his basic training at Fort Thomas, Ky., and took further training at Camp Shelby, Miss. Before he was sent overseas in October, 1944, he was stationed at Camp Atterbury for a month's training.

Pvt. Engelking had been a member of the Seymour Church of the Nazarene since he was ten years old, and was a deeply religious young man. His parents state that just six weeks ago they received a letter from him in which he told them that he was very thankful that he was "saved and sanctified."

Pvt. Engelking has two brothers, Richard, age eighteen, and Kenneth, age fourteen, at home.
