

REPORT MEN FROM 106TH AS MISSING

Were Residents Here During Time Division Was In Training At Atterbury

Numerous messages have been received by Franklin and Johnson county residents in the past few days from wives of members of the 106th Division, announcing that their husbands had been wounded or killed or listed as missing in action.

Reports Friday

Among the reports received Friday concerning members of the 106th Division, were:

Mrs. Cecil Miller received a telephone message Thursday evening from Mrs. Melvin H. Yorks at Rochester, New York, stating that Corp. Yorks had been reported by the War Department as missing in action in Germany, since Dec. 16, Corp. and Mrs. Yorks had lived at the Miller home while he was in training with the 106th Division at Camp Atterbury.

Mrs. Ira Zornes of Wellston, Ohio, has notified Mr. and Mrs. Walter Caplinger, that her husband, Pvt. Ira Zornes of the 106th Division, has been missing in action in Germany since Dec. 16. Pvt. and Mrs. Zornes and son, Larry Lee, lived with Mr. and Mrs. Caplinger while the 106th was at Camp Atterbury.

Three Missing

Wives of three members of the 106th Division, Mrs. Loui Turry, Mrs. Forest Strong, and Mrs. Chief Krupinski, have notified Mrs. Carl Legan that their husbands, S Sgt. Turry, S Sgt. Strong and S Sgt. Krupinski, are missing in action in Germany. The three sergeants and their wives stayed at the Legan home while the 106th was training at Camp Atterbury before going overseas.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Hardin have received word from the wives of three members of the 106th Division that they have been notified their husbands are missing in action. Two of the men on the 16th of December and other one on the 19th. They are Pfc. Robert H. Montgomery, Cpl. Galey Camfield and T Sgt. Samuel F. Baxter. They also have word that Pvt. Carlton Schaffer, who trained at Camp Atterbury with the 608th Tank Destroyer Division, was killed in action on Jan. 9th. All of the couples lived at the Hardin home on North Walnut street while they were in Franklin.
