

FRED L. GRAHAM IS KILLED WITH GLIDER TROOPS

stayed at her home while stationed at Camp Atterbury a year ago with the 30th Division, have been killed in action, while another has been wounded and is now a patient at Billings General hospital in Indianapolis.

The two killed were Sgt. L. M. C. (Bud) Hargrove on Jan. 23 in Belgium and Pfc. Thomas Huffman on Nov. 24. Both were in the 120th Infantry. Sergeant Hargrove was from Covina, Calif., and Private Huffman from Sparta, Minn.

Mrs. Johnson received a letter last week from Mrs. Hargrove saying she believed her husband was all right.

The wounded soldier is Staff Sgt. Charles Jensen, who is reported to be in a serious condition at Billings hospital. Mrs. Johnson was not informed through a letter from him just what his injuries were, although she was told he had three operations on one arm, which is perfectly stiff.

The three soldiers and their wives all resided at the Johnson home at the same time.

First Sgt. Edward Olecki of the 106th Division has been missing in action since Dec. 16, according to word received by Mr. and Mrs. John Watson, 429 Twelfth street. While he was stationed at Camp Atterbury with the 106th, Sgt. and Mrs. Olecki resided at the Watson home. They are from Scranton, Pa.
