

DONALD CLARK NOT WOUNDED

Another War department telegram concerning Tech. 5 Donald L. Clark, local soldier serving with the 106th Division, was received over the weekend by his wife, Mrs. Florence Clark of 423 Jones street, and stated that he had not been wounded, as previously reported by the War department.

On the basis of the latest telegram, it is believed likely that Clark has been in a hospital because of illness, but no direct word has been received from him for seven weeks. Clark is a son of Mr. and Mrs. James C. Clark of 423 Jones street.

In a War department telegram Feb. 16, Clark was listed as missing in action. Later his wife and parents received letters written Jan. 14 and Jan. 16 in a hospital on the Western front. One of the letters was from Clark, while the other was from an aid man and was written for Clark. These letters were followed by a War department telegram the first of this month, stating that Clark had been slightly wounded on Jan. 27 in Belgium.

The telegram this weekend stated that the report that he had been wounded was in error, but but did not give his present location or any other details.
