

Six Troopships Due In N. Y. Today

NEW YORK, Oct. 6 (U.P.)—Six troop ships were scheduled to arrive in strike-bound New York harbor today with 5,635 veterans aboard.

The army port of embarkation said there had been no discussion of having troopships dock at other ports to avoid being tied up here after discharging troops.

More than 350 vessels were frozen at their piers by the strike of 60,000 stevedores and other dockworkers.

Aboard the La Cros E Victory today were 1,985 troops, including reconnaissance troops of the 106th infantry division signal company and the second battalion, 424th regiment, 106th division.

The Frederick Victory carried 1,976, including the first battalion, 424th infantry regiment, and the third battalion, 422nd infantry regiment, 106th division.

The Sommelsdijk carried 1,573, including the third battalion, 423rd regiment, 106th division, and 331st medical battalion, 70th infantry division postal detachment.

The General Fleischer carried 37; the Crosby Noyes, 39, and the Mary Pickersgill, 25. Troops on the latter two will go to Camp Kilmer, N. J. All others will be processed at Camp Shanks, N. Y.
