CORRECTING THE RECORDS

MASON CITY—There is an article on page 10 of your Oct. 3 edition that I don't agree with. It concerned the 106th division and 159th regiment. First it states that the 159th was among the units which held a ring of steel around the German forces in the French ports of Lorient and St. Nazaire, then the regiment sped to the Rhineland about a month before V-E day.

Now here are the facts, the 422nd and 423rd regiments were the units that assisted the 68th division in making the ring of steel. The northern France campaign star was awarded the 106th for the action of these regiments between May 8 and 18, 1945 at which time the 159th was in Germany. They have the star but do not deserve credit for the action.

How about giving the credit where it is due?
