

Public May See Sunday's Guard Action

**National Guardsmen
From Bedford, North
Vernon and Seymour
To Train at Freeman**

Members of Company B, 138th Tank Battalion (Medium) of Seymour, and other National Guardsmen from Bedford and North Vernon will gather at Freeman Field Sunday for the second field training period of a series being arranged for the guardsmen.

Marshall Lentz, of Bedford, executive officer of the 138th, in charge of the training setup, announced an innovation beginning with Sunday's field meeting. A 15-minute religious service will start off the day-long classes at Freeman Field at 9 o'clock Sunday morning, with the service to be in charge of the Rev. Charles D. Patterson, pastor of the Trinity Methodist Church.

Capt. John N. Owens, commanding officer of Company B, cordially invites the public to Freeman Field to witness phases of the training program, which Sunday calls for classes in tank driving, truck driving, driver aptitude testing and communication work.

Visitors will not be allowed on the parade grounds where the tanks will be driven, Capt. Owens said, but they may watch the tank driving from the road or witness other activities.

In case of rain, an inclement weather service has been arranged for the training, guard officers said.

Sunday's program was postponed from March 18 because of lack of tanks and training equipment. Tanks have been brought to Freeman Field this week from
